Statistics and Finance

Beginning this month the Session, with the help of the Finance Committee, will be making the effort to keep you updated on some of the statistics of our church.

We have 128 members on our church roles. Please keep this number in mind as you see the date we will be sharing throughout the coming year.

The church is required to pay a "per capita" assessment to Presbytery each year. For the coming year the assessment is \$32.00 per member. That means that \$4096.00 has to come out of our budget. For this reason, as in past years, we are asking members who can afford to pay their per capita assessment to do this before the end of 2015.

Those of you who have attended our meeting/worship services this past year know that we have refinanced our mortgage. This means that the monthly mortgage payment has been reduced to approximately \$970.00 per month. If you are not currently contributing to the building fund please consider doing so.

It is difficult to make and implement a budget without knowing what friends and members are willing to pledge so it is important that pledge cards be returned ASAP to Marcia Vair.

As we publish monthly statistics please keep in mind that people make their offerings at different times. Some make a weekly offering while others may update pledges monthly, quarterly, or yearly. This will be reflected in the data that will be presented.
