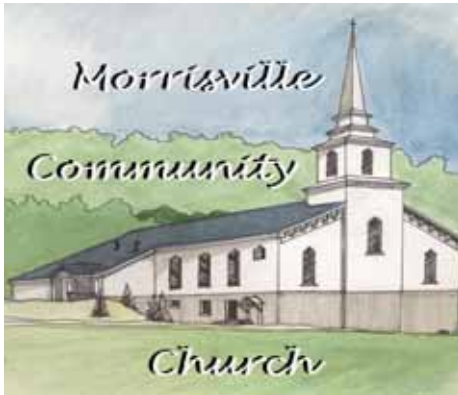

Children's Christmas Shopping Project at the Clothes Basket

The Children's Christmas shopping project was held over four evenings this year, Nov. 30 through Dec. 3. This is the sixth year of this project, the purpose of which is to give children the opportunity to give back to others.

Families were scheduled to come to the Clothes Basket at the Morrisville Community Church at specific appointment times so each family was there by themselves. The children shopped for gifts to give to close family members in our special Christmas shop while the adults shopped the Clothes Basket.



We had 21 children and 7 families total, names supplied by the elementary school nurse. The children averaged finding 10 gifts each—for moms, dads, siblings, grandparents, etc. Each gift was tagged and wrapped and sent home to be placed under the tree. A total of eleven volunteers spread over the four nights helped the children and parents shop each night. Everything was provided to these families for free that evening.



A big **Thank You** to all who donated gifts and wrappings to us for this project. And another big **Thank You** to the volunteers who gave up their busy evenings to help the children shop. We plan on continuing this program next year so anyone who has any extra "medium" sized (approx. 9" x 12") gift bags after the holiday, please consider donating them to us. It is mid-December and as I write this, I am musing on how this season, thus far, had not provided any opportunities to muse while shoveling. I am not complaining because, as always, the good Lord provided other occasions for musing. The latest opportunity presented itself when I was asked to help a friend ready his home for the winter. When he first asked I had jokingly responded, "Sure that's why God put us all on the same planet." The following days as we readied his house I mused that helping each other is, most likely, one big reason God put us all on the same planet. It is rather convenient that opportunities to help each other are so readily available, so close at hand and that helping someone does not always require a lifesaving gesture. The simple offering of a ride to someone in need can seem like a lifesaving gesture.

In my early Navy days, I was stationed at the Naval Submarine School in Groton, Connecticut. A base of unique design such that no matter where you are walking your destination is always uphill and, always, head on into the wind. On one particularly windy day, my boss gave me one hour to move out of my barracks and into another barracks clear across the base. I did not have a care at the time and having only one hour I ran uphill to my old barracks, threw all of my stuff into my duffle bag and into my folding garment bag, strapped it all to my back and started the *uphill* trek to my new home. My folding garment bag was so stuffed it would no longer fold and so was like a wing on back which magnificently caught the billowing headwind causing me to fight for every *uphill* step. If not for the extreme weight of my duffle bag I would surely have blown away. After many minutes of climbing the bases main road, a random sailor driving passed in his pickup truck stopped and offered me a ride. A simple offer of a ride, a lifesaving gesture.

When I offered to pay him for his kindness, he responded with "when I do something nice for someone it makes me feel good inside. If I accept money from you, you are buying that feeling back and it's not for sale at any price."

That ride and the response to the payment offer are a big part of who I am. Those two simple things helped shape me as a person. God put us on the same planet not only to help each other out but also to be assisted in becoming who we are.

In October we wrote a grant to the Mid-York Foundation asking for funds to help with the cost of utilities, plowing and food purchases. We were informed before Christmas that we were being granted \$4000. The CNY Food Bank informed us that we were receiving a grant through them of \$1000 which was the result of the Boiler Maker Race Give to Charity. During the Christmas season we were blessed with another \$1000 from personal giving.

We are also fortunate that the current volunteer staff has agreed to continue with us as we proceed with this new venture. Their experience will be much appreciated throughout the coming months.
