She wanted to make something for people to sample with a product that we had a hard time getting people to take. The tasty treat she whipped together was Texas Caviar with kidney beans, very much like a salsa. It was very good. Justae will try and come to the pantry at least once a month.

We enrolled ten new families in May with a total of forty households coming to the Pantry.

We had some sizeable food donations, one from Morrisville Commons at Morrisville State and another from the COVE Salvage Program at Colgate University. Food and hygiene donations for the month totaled 752 items. Fifty-five dollars was also received.

**Property Committee**

Ron reported on the Code Enforcement. We have asked for an extension of time for reevaluation. The Hoods in the kitchen have not been cleaned yet. The batteries are on order for the exit signs. The labeling of all of the switches need to be completed. Other items have been corrected.

The items from the Sunday School Office have been evaluated, sorted and placed in their new areas. The room can now be used as a Sunday school classroom when needed.

Sylvia met with Marlon Brown about the areas that we had listed needing repairs. The sanctuary ceiling water mark was of major concern. So we asked him to evaluate the roof. Marlon asked Jim from Campany Roofing (Oneida) to come and help him evaluate it. The roof is 22 years old. Shingle, plywood, nails, boots, etc. were in need of repair. He said that we could replace the individual areas needing repair but it would cost more than replacing the whole roof.

After our discussion on Wednesday night we came to the conclusion that the whole roof should be replaced now. A proposal has been provided by Campany Roofing.

Our biennial bazaar will be held on Saturday, November 2, 2019, from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. Plans and preparations are underway as the time approaches. Now is the time to mark your calendars and get started on your projects.

**The Twisted Vine**, chaired by Maxine Hunter with help from Ann Berlew, is our featured booth this month. Suggestions from these two creative ladies follow:

#### **Things people could make and donate:**

- Small to medium size Fall/Thanksgiving floral arrangements
- Small to medium size Christmas arrangements
- Center pieces for both Christmas and Thanksgiving
- Wreaths for fall/Thanksgiving
- Small to medium Christmas wreaths---
- Small bundles of bittersweet
- Various Potted Plants: Example: Christmas cactus.

#### **Accessories for arrangements:**

- Collect acorns for fall arrangements and wreaths
- Collect different size pine cone and spruce cones-
- Wreath forms of all types---but not too large (don't need many but a few would be nice)
- Fall and Christmas "artificial floral picks"
- Article stems of fall type fillers: example: berries, fall leaves of all shapes, etc.,
- Article stems of Christmas type fillers: Various holly stems; different greenery stems, etc.
- Ribbon: Red, Green, White---, Fall color: Brown, burn-orange, yellow, gold etc..... Ribbon should not have a "busy" pattern...

#### **Containers for arrangements:**

- Interesting mugs or cups, etc., Example: Smiley Face Mug; Snoopy mug
- Pitchers of various sizes and color
- Containers for Fall: Pumpkin, Turkey, Duck shapes make really nice arrangements
- Small to medium size baskets
- Small to medium size cornucopias

**Closer to the bazaar---probably in early October--- we plan to have a workshop where we can get together to create a few arrangements and wreaths, and/or make available materials for those who prefer to work at home.**
