Summer Songs

“Sing a new song to the Lord! Sing to the Lord, all the world!” Psalm 96: 1

It is now June. Summer is slowly arriving. It is time to enjoy the new life that surrounds us. Wildlife is at its zenith as the new born of the year can be seen in yards (baby squirrels), pastures (fawns) and streams (ducklings). The Honeysuckle and Dame’s Rocket are in full bloom. Spring greens are changing over to the darker greens of summer. The grass and the dandelion appear to be leaping out of the ground. The songs of the returning birds have softened. These hymns really resonate with me. When singing hymns such as “Fairest Lord Jesus”, “How Great Thou Art” and even “The Holly and the Ivy”, I always seem to experience a “close encounter of the third kind” with God. The message: This is indeed our Father’s world of which we all are one.

Prayer: Dear God, we give thanks to the Psalmists whose “summer songs” have inspired so many of our hymns which praise you and your creation. We give you thanks for our poets and song writers, who inspired by the Psalms, have given us our own “songs of summer”. The songs that remind us that all creation is connected and thus, connected to You. In Jesus name we pray and sing: “let us sing together one and all a joyous song.” Amen

From the Food Pantry

The Pantry served 44 families in April that provided 1,197 meals. Eighty-eight (88) food product donations were received and a monetary donation of \$28.65 from the Caribbean American Student Union Club at Morrisville State College.

We also received the Mid-York Foundation \$4,000 grant, which is to be used to pay for a portion of Cornell's utilities, snowplowing and pantry food purchases. This has to be used within one year with documentation as to how it was spent.

We have entered into a contract with Cornell Cooperative Extension, beginning in April, for \$125 a month to cover our costs for use of the building.

From the Property Committee

We still need volunteers to manage the Crane Garden and Chapel area. Adam, from the College Horticulture Dept. has not returned calls so the status of the bushes that were removed last fall are on hold. There is a lot of "winter burn" on some of the remaining bushes that will need to be monitored.

There was a brief discussion on lower level entrance and the possibility of having an intercom lock system. The Craft Sale was a success and will be held again in the fall. Tables and chairs will be loaned out for graduation (May 20-22).

A list of jobs that could be done by individuals will be posted in Fellowship Hall in the near future. If you should have some extra time and energy to help spruce up the church, please contact Ron or Sylvia to arrange for opening the church and having supplies available for the time and job that you choose.

DAD'S TOOL BOX

Proverbs 4:1-3

*Listen, my sons, to a father's instruction;
pay attention and gain understanding.
I give you sound learning, so do not forsake
my teaching.
For I too was a son to my father, still tender,
and cherished by my mother.*

As a child whenever I needed any tool for any project I would go to the basement and find my dad's toolbox. Small and red; dad's toolbox was a magical place. It always had the right tool for the right job. It had every tool that would ever be needed for any project that would ever be done. There were hammers, saws, squares, tape measures, from pliers to pipe wrenches; they were all there. In contained tools for carpentry, plumbing, masonry, electrical, everything. It truly was magical how much that little toolbox could hold. Attached to each tool like an invisible instruction booklet; were the 'tricks of the trade'. My dad could have been any of the workers mentioned in *1 Chronicles 22:15* "You have many workers: stonecutters, masons and carpenters, as well as those skilled in every kind of work".

In his younger years my dad had completed numerous trade schools and throughout the years as my dad and I tackled various household projects he imparted on me a wealth of information. He taught me the importance of stepping back and developing a plan of attack before diving headlong in to a project. And yes everything was a project because, as you know, any *small job* can become a *large project*. Not only did my dad teach me how to adapt to a situation should plans go awry he also always stressed that every project was a learning experience for the next one. Always remember what you learn, be it from mistakes or successes, and apply it to the situation. As *Exodus 35:10* says "All who are skilled among you are to come and make everything the LORD has commanded:" I don't know if we made everything the Lord commanded but we made everything we needed.

Now years later I have my own tool box and in it nestled among the tools I have collected over the years are the "tricks of the trade" and the lessons my dad taught me. I also find tools that my dad gave me that I didn't know I took with me. I find patience, perseverance, self-confidence and most importantly the humility to know when it's time to call in the experts. Because of my father's 'tools' I can do as commanded in *Colossians 3:12* "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

My dad was a teacher, mentor and friend and although he's been gone for many years I thank him every day for the tools and lessons he left for me in my 'toolbox'. *Deuteronomy 33:11* says "Bless all his skills, LORD, and be pleased with the work of his hands." My dad's greatest skill was as a father and I feel I am one of his greatest works.
