### **From the Property Committee**

We had four women from COVE, at Colgate, come and scrub the Youth Room and hallways on January 22. A note was sent to them thanking them for a job well done. We plan on painting all of the area in the near future. Three persons have volunteered to help. It was agreed upon that the hand prints on the walls would need to be removed to make the job easier. We

have, therefore, taken photos of them so they can be remembered.

Notification of deadline date for bids for mowing this 2016 season were sent out February 11 to David Bohndorf, Randy Groves, Matthew Dillon and David Pearsall. The deadline date is March 11, 2016.

We have had a flame-out on the other boiler. Repair was done and all are working well. I spoke with Randy, an area manager, about the longevity of the boilers. He said our boilers are in good shape. We have had them well maintained and should be able to have them for 5-10 more years. We have Fulton boilers, but he said there are others that are available depending on our need. They service many brands. There is no problem in getting the boilers in and out of the building.

ThyssenKrupp (elevator) is still working on our discrepancy service/payments for past years. We are billed for the next service (which has not been done) but will not pay until the service is received.

Pruning of front and back shrubs and trees has been done by Dana St. Louis. The college will be working on the replacement of the yews that were removed in the fall.
