Easter is a Season

“Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.” Psalm 118:1

It is May 5, 2019, the 3rd Sunday of Easter. Yes, I said this correctly. May 5 is the 3rd Sunday of Easter. We don't often think this way concerning the Easter celebration. In fact, for years I thought Easter was one Sunday, but it is a season of seven weeks—a week of Sundays spanning 50 days. Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter. Therefore, after the Sunday of the Resurrection, they are named Second Sunday of Easter, Third Sunday of Easter, etc. up to the Seventh Sunday of Easter, while the whole fifty-day period concludes with Pentecost Sunday.

Technically, we are to continue celebrating Easter---or at least to be joyous in our faith—as we each journey through the Easter season. Beginning now, with the 3rd Sunday of Easter, I have listed prayers/and scriptures from the Presbyterian Mission PC(USA) web-site to help guide our Easter journey from this day forth to Pentecost Sunday, June 9, 2019.

3rd Sunday of Easter

Lord, you have called us to be fishers of people and shepherds of your flock. Teach us to follow, to love and to serve; to feed those who hunger and cast out our nets to welcome the world into your eternal realm; through Jesus Christ, the fish, the lamb, the Lord. **John 21:1-19**

4th Sunday of Easter

Living God, you open your hand to give us the gift of eternal life and to feed us with your abundant mercy. Let nothing take us from your presence, but bless and keep us always; in Jesus Christ our Lord, who is one with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

John 10:22-30

5th Sunday of Easter

Living God, we have seen your glory in Jesus Christ, your Word, our Lord. By your grace you have made us beloved children. Now make us faithful disciples, loving one another as Christ loves us; in his holy name we pray. **John 13:31-35**

6th Sunday of Easter

Living God, through Jesus Christ you give peace that the world cannot give. By the power of your Holy Spirit calm our troubled and fearful hearts

and fill them with rejoicing as we await Christ's glorious return; we pray this in his name. **John 14:23-29**

7th Sunday of Easter

Worship Committee is reviewing and revising the manual "Duties of Church Members Called Upon to Serve". This is the revised information for the church nursery.

Nursery

The nursery is available for children in grade 2 and below. Children in grade 3 and above are expected to remain in church for the entire service.

All children, regardless of grade, should attend the beginning of the church service. Children in grade 2 may leave for the nursery after the offering is taken or after the children's message is given, whichever comes last in the order of the service.

Volunteers staff the nursery. Parents of children attending the nursery are expected to take turns on the schedule each month, signing up on the clipboard when it comes around. Any other adults or teenagers are welcome to volunteer for nursery duty also and should sign up on the clipboard.

There are some games and craft kits in the nursery that may be used. Or the volunteer may bring their own activities to use with the children.

The Nursery should be picked up at the end of the church service. Games, craft items and toys should be put away. Scrap papers and waste items should be placed in the wastebasket. Anything taken out of cupboards and/or cabinets should be put away.

Parents should pick up their children as soon as the service is over, before attending coffee hour.

Sunday School Office - During the past 22 years we have accumulated many different items in the room we call Sunday School Office. Due to a leaky faucet it was necessary for us to remove all of those items and place them elsewhere (the Classroom next to the Library). The Sunday School Office had become a catch-all.

The Property Committee is arranging for all members of the church to choose which items will be kept and which will be trashed. A clipboard with a spreadsheet will be in the classroom next to the Library starting April 20, and will be available anytime the church is open. The last day it will be available is May 20. One month should be adequate. The spreadsheets will be reviewed by the Property Committee and the designated items will be kept, all others trashed. THANK YOU IN ADVANCE FOR YOUR HELP.

ASKING SESSION APPROVAL:

- 1) Property Committee asks for approval of Ron's contract to say: "four weeks' vacation" (instead of three).
- 2) Property Committee asks for approval of Ron's pay "to be based on minimum pay of \$11.10".
- 3) Property Committee asks for approval to purchase a new floor buffer at about \$1,400.
- 4) The Property Committee was approached by the owner of "The Hot Dog Truck" requesting the use of our kitchen as a "back-up" cooking area. The committee feels it is a for profit business - declines.

Chris Brown of Kendra's Landscaping will be mowing this year at \$2860. for the season. Roger Gray has completed the repair of the outside faucet and shut of valve by the nursery. The cost of two sets and labor is \$307.00.

Sittsy will be contacted to get an approval date to seal the drives. There are a number of jobs and repairs that we will ask Marlon Brown for his assistance (roof, ceiling/sanctuary, stairwell, woman's room) Chris Davis will be connected by Nate to work on the tractor.

Spring jobs to be completed: screens, windows washed, FH walls, windows sanctuary, molding between FH and narthex, bells uprights.

Food Pantry

We are starting to see an increase in the number of families visiting the Pantry. Thirty-seven families came for assistance in March, made up of 25 children, 68 adults and 10 seniors. We had six new enrollees.

Our new glass front refrigerator and freezer are in place thanks to the crew and expertise of Mark Shepard, Seth Downen, Bill Pond and some of their friends. We are very fortunate to have these new pieces of equipment. They have really helped with distribution selections without having to keep doors open and no defrosting required on the freezer. That's the best! \$240 of the \$2,779 Operation Support grant money received has been returned to the Food Bank as a refund.

There are certain procedures that need to be followed with the disposition of equipment we do not wish to keep. Since both the refrigerator and freezer belong to the NYS Department of Health and are still in working order, we can either transfer them to another pantry or fill out the appropriate forms and submit to the Food Bank to see what our best options are.

Food Bank Facts: \$.96 of every dollar donated assists people in need. Every \$1.00 donated provides enough food for three meals. 100+ retail partners donate food.
