“Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.” Hebrews 12: 1

There is something about November. Is it the cold, frosty air? Is it the colorful leaves falling, falling, falling, and leaving only barren branches to grace the sky? Is it the days growing steadily darker? Is it the last of harvest time? Is it simply a time of thanksgiving? Perhaps it is all of these things. But ever so slowly my thoughts turned. This quote from the PCUSA web-site explains:

I hope you take a few moments to remember and then to make a list of those who’s ordinary, holy lives helped guide and nurture your faith.

With assistance from the CNY Food Bank the food pantry will be relocated to the Cooperative Extension building and the Morrisville Community Church will assume administrative responsibilities.
