May my meditation be pleasing to him, as I rejoice in the LORD.

In the bible the act of praying is talked about over 500 times. 1 Thessalonians 5:17, one of the Bible's shortest verses, tell us to "pray continually".

We have all heard of or have proof that prayer works. Have you ever wondered why?

As usual I spent some time musing about it and here is what I have come up with...

Some years ago a study was done involving the power of prayer several people were CAT Scanned while in the act of prayer. While they prayed a normally quiet part of the brain became very active. The harder they prayed the more active it became.

I believe that even though God knows what we need before we need it when we pray we open ourselves up and become more receptive to God's gifts. It also helps us reaffirm that what we pray for is what we really want.

For example; praying for success while hunting for lost car keys results in success because praying helps us relax and receive God's insight to their location. Or do we really want that new job in Saskatchewan...

Group prayer also taps into God by allowing His gift of energy / power / love to be shared and subsequently focused by all those in the group because we are all connected spiritually through God. This spiritual connection has been called a "gestalt" by some. A gestalt is something that is much more than just the sum of its parts. A car for instance is a gestalt. All its parts together make a mode of transportation but a "car" is more than just transportation it is also sign of independence, a rite of passage in to adulthood, etc. A "car" is much more than just the sum of its parts.

Praying for a person's healing or wellbeing by a group uses our gestalt to focus all the love given by God onto that person.

For me being able to theorize how and why something works make it a bit more tangible and becomes something I believe in more strongly.

From the Food Pantry

Three new families were enrolled in September among the twenty-five that came to the pantry. Seven hundred twenty nine (729) meals were provided. Thirty dollars (\$30) in cash was received and 411 donations of food and other products. Among the food donations we are now receiving the harvests of local farmers and gardeners - tomatoes, peppers, eggs, squash and cucumbers.
